

Stand with the Wet'suwet'en opposing the CGL pipeline

Last year the Wet'suwet'en were violently raided by the RCMP when they stood up to protect their land from the Coastal GasLink LNG pipeline – a project being rammed through their territory without their consent.

The stand-off has continued, and now the RCMP is poised to act again. British Columbia recently brought the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People (UNDRIP) into law, making it a requirement for government to seek free, prior and informed consent from Indigenous rights and title-holders before building projects on their land. But in direct violation of UNDRIP, we are now witnessing yet another case of Indigenous people being denied the declaration's protections on their own land.

For nearly ten years, Wet'suwet'en Hereditary Leaders have made it clear they want no pipelines on the Wet'suwet'en Yintah – the Wet'suwet'en traditional territory. The Nation had the rights over its traditional lands confirmed in a landmark 1997 ruling of the Supreme Court of Canada.

At stake is a proposed 670km-long pipeline running fracked natural gas from Northeastern BC fracking fields to what would be Canada's largest LNG terminal in Kitimat on the BC Pacific Coast. Passing through Wet'suwet'en territory, it and all other oil and gas pipelines have been unanimously rejected by all Wet'suwet'en Clan Houses.

Stand.earth is seeking a passionate and experienced campaigner to develop and implement strategies to raise awareness and build power to stop the expansion of the oil and gas sector.

In October 2018, the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) described the terrifying impacts of even a 1.5°C rise in global temperatures and warned the international community about the importance of limiting any further warming beyond this point. The authors of the IPCC report reminded us that a societal transformation of this scale "is possible within the laws of chemistry and physics," but will require "unprecedented changes" before 2030. One of the clearest steps we need to take to avoid this impending disaster is to stop approving and building new fossil fuel projects now.

To this end, Stand's Canadian climate and energy campaigns have focused on raising the ambition of climate policy and stopping new tar sands projects like the Trans Mountain pipeline and the Teck Frontier Mine. In the coming months, we will expand the scope of our work to include working to stop the growth of fracking and LNG in British Columbia. **We encourage applicants to apply by February 21, 2020. This position is open until filled.**

Reporting to the Canadian Oil and Gas Programs Manager, **this position is responsible for aiding in developing and implementing our Canadian oil and gas campaign strategy, supporting issue research, conducting government relations, communicating through traditional and digital channels with key audiences, coordinating with allies, and executing public actions.** Successful candidates will demonstrate a background in climate and energy policy, public and government relations and a history of working in allyship with Indigenous Peoples. This position is based in British Columbia with a preference for candidates in our Vancouver hub office. **This is a full-time position with excellent benefits. Salary is commensurate with experience and adjusted based on location, but will likely be within the range of \$70,000.00 to 85,000.00 CAD.** This position will work closely with the development and digital teams and must have a strong interest and/or commitment to Stand.earth's values.

Key Responsibilities

- With the direction of our Canadian Oil and Gas Programs Manager the successful candidate will help our Canadian Oil and Gas team to develop and implement a strategy to stop the growth of the tar sands, and fracking and LNG in British Columbia
- Build and manage relationships with elected and government officials
- Develop and execute online and offline tactics that support and achieve campaign goals and objectives, including the recruitment of supporters online and offline
- Support industry and issue-focused research

RP: Pivot Legal Society

The legal community in Vancouver, Coast Salish Territories is coming together in support of the Wet'suwet'en Nation by holding a "Know Your Rights" workshop to raise funds for the Unist'ot'en legal defence fund and the Gidimt'en frontlines.

As a community with specialized knowledge and training in colonial law, we have a moral imperative to actively support the Wet'suwet'en Nation as they assert jurisdiction under their laws to control access to their territory. All 5 clans of the Wet'suwet'en Nation have clearly opposed the pipeline in their territory and they have not provided free, prior, and informed consent to Coastal Gaslink/ TransCanada to do work on Wet'suwet'en lands.

Organizations, including the Union of Bc Indian Chiefs, Pivot Legal Society, Community Legal Assistance Society, BC Civil Liberties Association and the West Coast Environmental Law will present on UNDRIP, "Know Your Rights" workshop on interacting with law enforcement, human rights, police complaints, and environmental law.

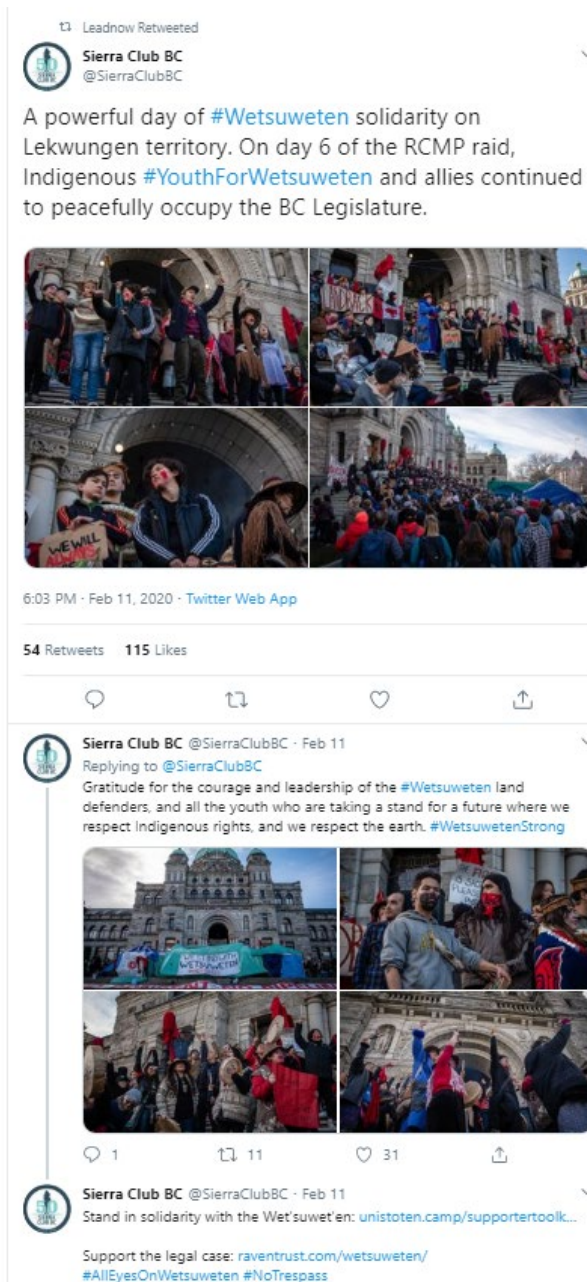

ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT NOT YET COMPLETE; B.C. NOT OBLIGATED TO PROCEED WITH COASTAL GASLINK PIPELINE

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE:

January 28, 2020

While Coastal GasLink has approval from the B.C. Environmental Assessment Office, a condition of the approval is that construction can't proceed until the Condition 1 Final Report #2 is approved. This report has not yet been approved by the Environment Assessment Office.

The Condition 1 Final Report assesses the Economic and Social Effects of the proposed project, among other impacts. Regarding Community and Regional Infrastructure and Services, the report states that the assessment of potential adverse effects was completed as part of the original environmental assessment application and that no further studies are required. However, since the time of the original environmental assessment application in 2014, the Unist'ot'en have built and begun operating a wilderness lodge and healing center.

The investment in buildings and infrastructure is valued at over \$2 million and the institution has just received \$400,000 from the First Nations Health Authority to continue to run land-based trauma and addictions treatment programs at the site.

"No construction can happen until this report is approved," said Sierra Club BC's campaigns director Caitlyn Vernon. "And to approve this report without fully considering the impacts of this proposed pipeline on the Unist'ot'en wilderness center and healing lodge would be profoundly problematic. I doubt a non-Indigenous wilderness lodge would be omitted from a report such as this."
